Wednesday Morning Driving Tour – Historic Lincoln Highway & Lunch at Corvette Café

The Lincoln Highway was the first paved coast-to-coast roadway, connecting New York to San Francisco. It is 3300 miles long and goes from New York's Time Square to San Francisco's Lincoln Park. It was built in 1920 with a layer of concrete topped with bricks on the surface. Omaha has the largest remaining original untouched brick paved section in the country. This nearly 3-mile-long tree-lined drive down the brick road with a train track on the side is a drive through an era gone by. In 1984 the highway was added to the National Register of Historic Places.

Not only will you see the historic brick road, but you will be able to drive on it. Halfway through the drive will be a nice photo-op for you and your Skyliner. Garett Brown, the IFRC photographer will be there taking photos. After the photos, we will drive the route again heading to lunch.

Located just around the corner is the Corvette Café. Located inside Gregg Young Chevrolet, for 20-plus years is the Corvette Café. Have breakfast, lunch, or an ice cream.
